Whereas Dominick Daley & James Kalligan, late residents of Boston, laborers. were before the Justices of our Supreme Judicial Court holden at Northampton, in and for Our County of Kampshire, were convicted of the crime of Murder committed on the body of one Marcus Lyon, and thereupon, by our said Justices, were Sentenced to suffer the pains of Death, As to us appears of record, an examplification of which is hereunto annexed, Whereby execution remains to be done ~

We therefore, by and with the advise of Our Council, pursuant to the Statute for such case made and provided, command you, that on Thursday the fifth day of June next, between the hours of twelve and three of the clock in the day time, at the usual place of execution, you cause execution on the persons of the said Dominick Daley and James Halligan, to be done and performed in all things according to the form and effect of the said judgment and sentence, for which this shall be your sufficient Warrant. Hereof fail not at your peril, and make return of this warrant with your doings herein into Our Secretary's Office within thirty days after the time expressed for its fulfillment.
