Agreeable to His Excellency's nominations of the eighth and twelfth of March last the Council advised & consented to the appointment of Isaac Mulliken of Townsend as a Justice of the Peace John Temple Jun^r of Reading and John Patch of Stow as Coroners for the County of Middlesex - Cecil Dwight of Northampton as a Coroner for the County of Hampshire George Bradbury of Portland as a special Justice of the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Cumberland and Benjamin Slack of Needham as a Justice of the Peace for the County of Norfolk
