



ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This house displays a modern adaptation of the popular Colonial style and has a twin facing it to the west. Each house is built of brick, and is two stories in height, with slate, hipped roof, one-story sun porch, and a symmetrical five-bay facade with central entrance, pedimented portico and six-over-six sash windows.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

In 1926 the State Legislature appropriated \$12,000.00 for the construction of two brick cottages for employees at the State Hospital. These were finished in 1928 and occupied in 1929, one by the steward and one by an assistant physician. They became known as houses 11 and 12.

In 1937 a three-car garage, of brick and concrete block construction, with slate roof, was erected between these two houses.
