Mr. SAUL COOPER is chosen Clerk of the Senate, and GEORGE R. MINOT, Esq. Clerk of the House of Representatives. On Thursday last, the committee of both branches of the Legislature, appointed to examine and count the votes, returned for Governor, for the Year ensuing, reported the whole number 507 Governor to be 24,588, of which his Excellency JOHN HANCOCK, Esquire, had 18,455. No choice of a person to fill the office of Lieutenant-Governor for the ensuing year, having been made by the people, the Hon. House of Representatives, agreeably to the Constitution, on Friday proceeded to ballot for two Candidates for that office, to be sent up to the Hon. Senate, when his Honour Thomas Cushing, Esq. (who had a unanimous vote) and the Hon. Nathaniel Gorham, Esq. were chosen, and sent up accordingly to the Senate then proceeded to the election of a Lieutenant-Governor, and his Honour Thomas Cushing, Esq. was unanimously elected. Friday afternoon, at five o'clock, the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor elect, having been previously notified of their respective elections, came into the Representative's chamber, where the two branches of the General Court were convened, when his Excellency the Governor was pleased to address them as follows: Gentlemen of the Senate, and Gentlemen of the House of Representatives, A Very respectable committee, by you appointed, have notified me that the citizens of this Commonwealth have elected you Governor for the year ensuing. To promote the happiness of my native country, hath always been the great object of my pursuit, and to merit the approbation of my fellow citizens was ever my highest ambition. I feel, I should feel myself ungrateful to an high degree, did I not, upon the present occasion, acknowledge the kind partiality of my country.
