RESOLVED, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America...

ARTICLE THE FIRST. After the first enumeration, required by the first article of the Constitution...

ARTICLE THE SECOND. No law, varying the compensation for the services of the Senators and Representatives...

ARTICLE THE THIRD. Congress shall make no law, establishing the articles of faith, or a mode of worship, or prohibiting the free exercise of religion...

ARTICLE THE SEVENTH. No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury...

ARTICLE THE EIGHTH. In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial...

ARTICLE THE NINTH. In suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury, shall be preserved...

ARTICLE THE TWELFTH. The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively...
