**A N E C D O T E.**  
From a late Dublin Paper.  
THE following whimsical circumstance happened  
some time ago in Killarney. A taylor who was  
married to a very sickly woman, grew enamour'd  
with a young girl who lived in his neighbourhood,  
who confided to grat him all he could with, provid-  
ed he would give her a promise in writing to marry  
her on the immediate demise of his rib, in conse-

**Commonwealth of Massachusetts.**  
In the House of Representatives, Feb. 8, 1792  
WHEREAS it is necessary that the en-  
couragement heretofore given to  
the manufacture of Sail-Cloth and Twine  
within this Commonwealth, should be re-  
newed:  
Resolved, That the resolution of the 28th  
of March 1788, granting a bounty on Duck,  
Sail-Cloth, and Twine, manufactured with-  
in this Commonwealth, be, and hereby is  
renewed and continued in full force, from  
the 1st day of January, 1792, to the first  
of July, 1793.  
It is further Resolved, That the Select-  
men of the several towns within this Com-  
monwealth, where such Manufactories are,  
or may hereafter be established, be, and here-  
by are authorized and required, to appoint  
one or more suitable persons in said town, as  
Inspectors of Duck and Twine, whose duty it  
shall be, to inspect the same agreeably to the  
resolution above-referred to; any thing in  
said resolution to the contrary notwithstanding.
