COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

In the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two. An Act to prevent damage by mischievous Dogs.

WHEREAS many persons in this Commonwealth, have been greatly exposed by being suddenly assaulted by mischievous dogs...

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That from and after passing this act, it shall and may be lawful, for any person or persons in this Commonwealth...

any dog, that shall be found out of the inclosure or immediate care of its owner or keeper, worrying, wounding or killing any neat cattle, sheep or lambs. And be it further enacted, That if any person shall be assaulted by any dog...

And be it further enacted, That if after such notice, such dog shall not be killed or confined...

And be it further enacted, That if any dog, after notice is given as aforesaid, shall by any sudden assault, in manner as aforesaid, wound or cause to be wounded...

And be it further enacted, That all laws heretofore made, for preventing damage being done by unruly dogs, (except such as are enacted to prevent damage being done by dogs in the Island of Nantucket) be, and they are hereby repealed...
