JHON HANCOCK, Esquire. GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

May it please your Excellency, The resolution adopted upon the subject on which the Legislature has been convened, will convince your Excellency, how fully we appreciate the vigilance and propriety of your conduct on this interesting occasion.

With respect to the suit of William Vafel, against the Commonwealth, no answer will be made; but at the same time, it may not be improper to observe, that if he shall exhibit to the Legislature, an equitable claim against this Commonwealth, in manner heretofore practised, justice will be rendered to him, in common with all others.

The Legislature need only sit, sir, that they carefully wish for the happy recovery, and re-establishment of your Excellency's health, as a relief and comfort to your friends, and a blessing to your country.

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In SENATE, September 23, 1793.

WHEREAS a decision has been had in the Supreme Judicial Court of the United States, that a State may be sued in the said Court, by a Citizen of another State, which decision appears to have been grounded on the second section of the third article in the Constitution of the United States.

Resolved, That a power claimed, or which may be claimed, of compelling a State to be made defendant in any Court of the United States, at the suit of an individual or individuals, is, in the opinion of this Legislature, unnecessary and inexpedient; and in its exercise, dangerous to the peace, safety, and independence of the several States; and repugnant to the first principle of a federal Government.

Therefore Resolved, That the Senators from this State, in the Congress of the United States, be, and they hereby are, instructed, and the Representatives required, to adopt the most speedy and effectual measures in their power, to obtain such amendments in the Constitution of the United States, as will remove any clause or article of the said constitution, which can be construed to imply or justify a decision, that a State is compelled to answer in any suit by an individual or individuals, in any court of the United States: And his Excellency the Governor is hereby requested to communicate the foregoing resolves to the Supreme Executives of the several States, to be submitted to the consideration of their respective Legislatures.

THE subscriber having met with the misfortune, totally to be shipwrecked, on the 15th day of February, last, in the bay of Boston, called Cobhane, on a naked rock, near a place named Bush Island; where he with his crew was for thirty-six hours exposed to a most severe gale with the frost and a thick fog, thoro' which they could not be discerned but as soon as the thick clouds began to disperse, they instantly, to their great joy, observed in the forenoon, the people on shore endeavouring to come out to them with boats in order to save them, though the sea was so high that their boats were thrice filled with water, and one of the boats shattered, whereby six of the hand were nearly lost.

Notwithstanding this, the feeling people on the shore did keep up their spirit, and the person there, named Mr. Shaw, then present, encouraged them, by addressing them thus: My friends! I need not remind you of the services, we, as human beings, owe one another; being fully conscious of your distressed minds, but this is an extraordinary case, in which we must do our best; these are the lines of twenty men in question to be saved, who will, most certainly, be found dead in less than an hour; come, my friends, I'll enter the boat for you men, although I am a bad swimmer;—and all the rest followed the Reverend, joyfully; they took us off the rock, made their home, attended us in our sicknesses, and carefully saved what they could from the ship and cargo, even to trifles, as watches, buckles, buttons, spoons, with other gold and silver ware, belonging to the subscriber, which they delivered him every night, coming from their work. The profligacy of these strangers, abiding us in our distress, I cannot express less in estimation, but by my word, and sincere thanks, voluntarily acknowledging, that the land possessed by such individuals, is happy, and the unfortunate man drove to their shore, cannot

his temples. It is presumed therefore, that the clergy in general would do well to unit to their congregation, respectively, to retire in their families; their closets, to commune with their own hearts; beseeching the divine goodness to over the present evil from us; grant us his mercy, that we may repent of our evil doings, and conform our lives and actions hereafter, to the honor and glory of God, the god of ablers and the salvation of our own souls.

The objects of the combined powers, now engaged against France, appear to be as follows:

The English and Spanish fleets to invest the French cities in the Mediterranean, to attract the attention of the republic to that quarter; and to assist the Saracines in recovering their country; and in entering France.

The Spaniards croiling the Pyrenees, and to penetrate into France, and by capturing the fortified places, to establish a chain of posts sufficient to prevent the introduction of French principles into Spain; and to assist in the re-establishment of the refractory priests.—The fleet under Lord Howe is laid to land a force in Brittany, to assist the rebels, if any are left unconquered. The French are to enter Alzette and Lorraine;—The Austrians to march in the Duke of Brunswick's track to Paris, and the English to attack Dunkirk. This is the work laid to be cut for the present campaign; whether the French will not spoil the situation of the first stand to alter the alliance, teach them all.
