SPORTING.

From a late English paper.

From the novelty of a cricket match announced to be played on Tuesday by 12 Greenwich pen-fighters with 12 Alford, against 11 with one arm, for 1000 guineas, in the new cricket ground, Montpelier Square, Walworth, an immense concourse of people assembled.—About nine o'clock the men arrived in three Greenwich bags; about twelve the wickets were pitched, and the game commenced. Those with but one leg had the first innings, and got 61 runs. About three o'clock, while those with two arms were having their innings, a fence of riot and disorder took place, owing to the practice of the populace to gain admittance to the ground; the gates were forced open, and several persons in the fence were knocked down, and a great number of persons having got upon the roof of a stable; the roof broke, and several persons falling among the bushes, were taken up, much bruised; above six hours was over, and those with one arm got 21 runs during their innings: The one leg communicated their second innings, and five bowled out such as they gen. ran, so that they left off 11 runs, than those with one arm. Next day the match was played out, and the men with one leg beat the one arm by 103 runs.—After the match was finished, the one leg men ran a race over a space of 100 yards distance for 10 guineas, and the three legs had prize.

The above match was made between Mr. Goldham and Mr. Bowles. Mr. Goldham was the winner.
