9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house first appears on the 1873 atlas, where it is listed as being owned by Elijah Nutting. Mr. Nutting is described as a carpenter in the 1873 directory and probably built the house himself. High St. was laid out about the time of the opening of the Williamsburg to Northampton Railroad in 1867. The tracks ran parallel to Main and North Main Sts. in Florence and a depot was established on North Maple St. This opening spurred industrial and residential development north of Main St. in Florence, which until that time had been completely contained between Main St. and the Mill River.

The house has front and side porches with chamfered posts and ornate brackets, and a simple balustrade. The windows have thin, molded cornices and there is a round-headed window with thin hood mould in the front gable.
