This shingle style residence was built in 1896 for J. H. Maloney and designed by Putnam and Bayley, local architects. The first shingle style residence in Northampton was designed by Putnam & Bayley in 1893 for Judge Hammond; this was a full decade after the early shingle projects of H. H. Richardson and McKim, Mead, and White.

The design includes a sweeping gable, classical motifs, and small scale shingling and clapboards on the exterior wall surface. It relates to other, earlier Queen Anne residences on Munroe and Columbus Streets as well as to Putnam's own Shingle style

residence on Columbus Avenue.
