

This house was built for Charles Sawyer, the assistant postmaster, in 1892. It's on lot 14 of the Columbus Ave. subdivision. The plan was filed in 1892, thus this is one of the first houses built on the street. The main feature is a three story tower with pyramidal, slate roof. Decoratively cut shingles are used in the gables, and as a band separating the first and second floors. A shallow, rectangular bay adorns the front, and a one story porch covers the entrance. The porch is composed of turned posts, balusters and spindles.
