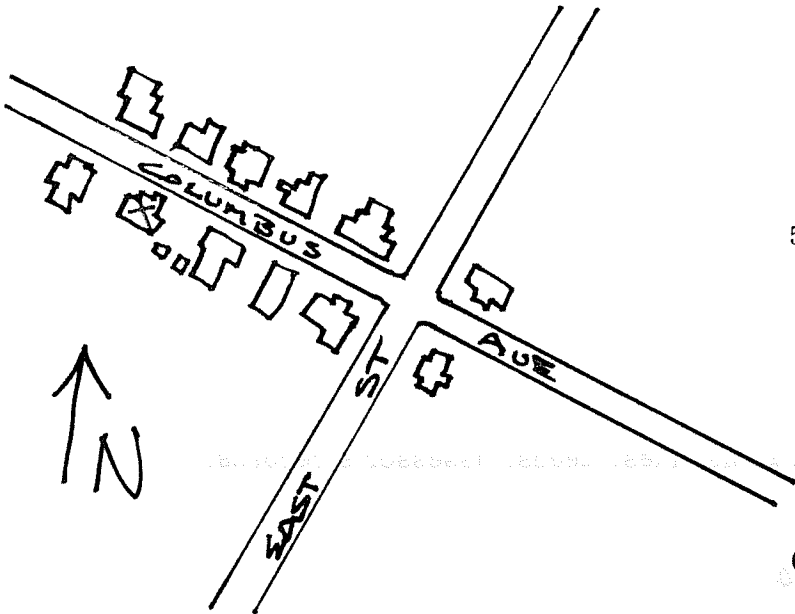

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house was built around the turn of the century on lot 9 of the Columbus Ave. subdivision. The plan was filed in 1892, but few houses were erected on the western side of the street in the early years. Asymmetrically massed, the house features a large, pedimented gable which tops a two-story front projection. A front porch with hipped roof and double Tuscan columns is topped by a smaller, screened porch with shed roof.
