This 24 story house was built in 1898 for George Drury, a steward at "Northampton Lunatic Hospital". Columbus Ave. was laid out in 1892 and lots were sold immediately. This house has a commanding location at the southwest corner of Columbus and East St., the only cross street. Its major decorative feature is the wrap-around porch, which has a conicallyroofed projection at the corner. The porch has Tuscan columns on a high, shingled base, which is pierced in several areas by groups of narrow rectangular slits. Decoratively cut shingles are used in the front gable, while a square entry window and leaded glass transom over the single larg window adorn the first floor of the facade.
