9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Arthur Tidd purchased lot 27 of the Columbus Fve. subdivision in 1905. The subdivision had been filed in 1392, and development had begun immediately. By 1395 seven houses had been built on the northern side of the street, while only two had been constructed on the southern side. Lots on the southern side of the street, east of East St. were not developed until after the turn of the century. Lot 27 is the southeasternmost lot in the development and is located at the brow of the old Mill River terrace. The meadows stretch easterly from here to the Connecticut Piver.

Arthur Tidd was employed as a carpenter for Smith College in 1905, but subsequently began a jobbing business on his own. He is listed as a carpenter and a builder in the early 20th century directories, and probably built his own house during this period.

The house is a simple two-story cube capped by a slate, high hip roof. A hipped dormer with double window pierces the front of the roof. A wide frieze, corner boards and window surrounds act as trim elements. A one-story hipped roof porch stretches across the facade.
