This large double house was built on Olive St. shortly after it opened in 1868. Olive St. was the first street strictly for subdivision opened off of South St. atop the terrace. The street was opened by Lewis and Charles Edwards, and James Ellsworth, all South St. farmers. In 1873 this house was owned by George Ellsworth, another South St. farmer.

By 1873 nine houses had been built on the street, all single houses except for this one. This house has the basic five-bay, central entrance colonial form with two inset chimneys and a two story rear ell. A double entry porch with turned posts, decorative brackets and a balustrade decorates the facade.
