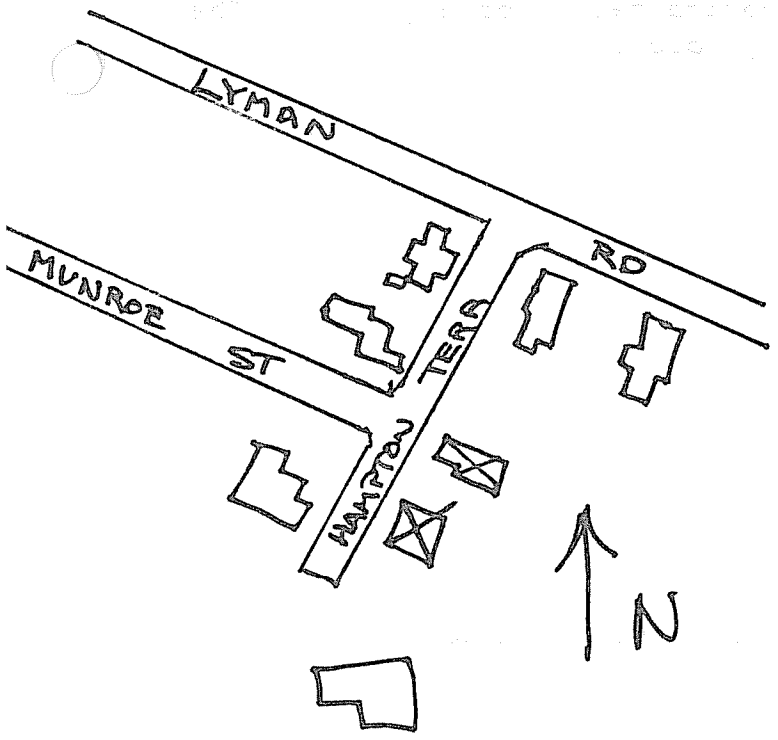

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house was built in 1894 for Charles Harris, a machinist for the Central Oilgas Stove Co. located at the foot of Munroe St., on Hampton Ter., the lot extends easterly over the brow of the old Mill River terrace into the meadows.

A high hip slate roof with front and side gabled projections caps the two story house. The gables are clad in fish-scale shingles. Wideboarding is used vertically and horizontally for emphasis. The entrance is recessed within a cut-away porch.
