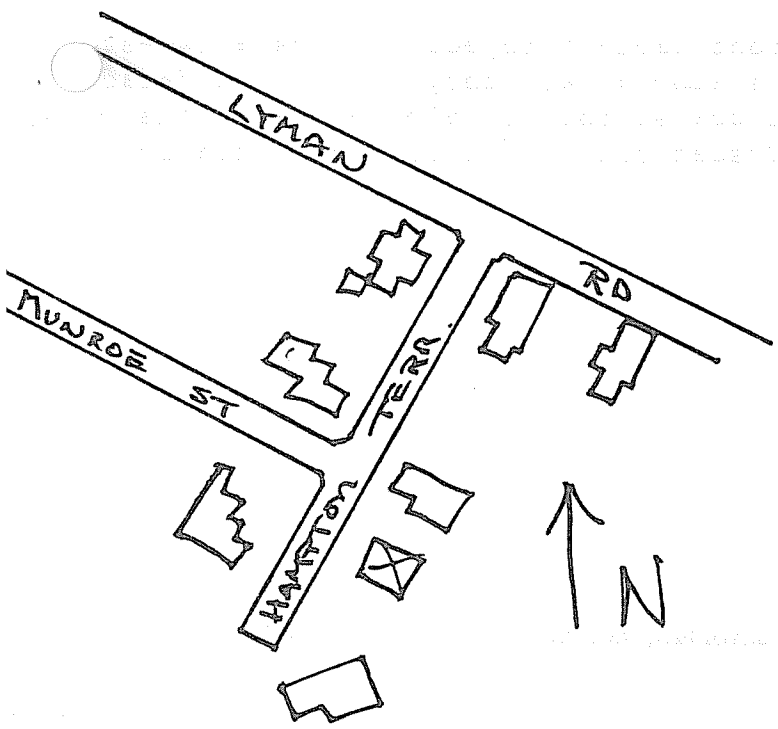

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This house was built in 1905-06 for Charles Gallup, employed at that time for the Smith Carr Baking Co. Gallup later ran a wholesale confectionery business out of his house. Located at the foot of Munroe St. on Hampton Ter., the lot backs up to the brow of old Mill River terrace. Meadows stretch easterly from here to the Connecticut River, providing a very scenic vista.

A high, hip slate roof, with front gabled projection caps a two-story block. The front pedimented gable is atop a two-story bow on the facade. Narrow corner boards, frieze, and window surrounds help delineate the mass, and a large one-story portico with Tuscan columns covers the entrance.
