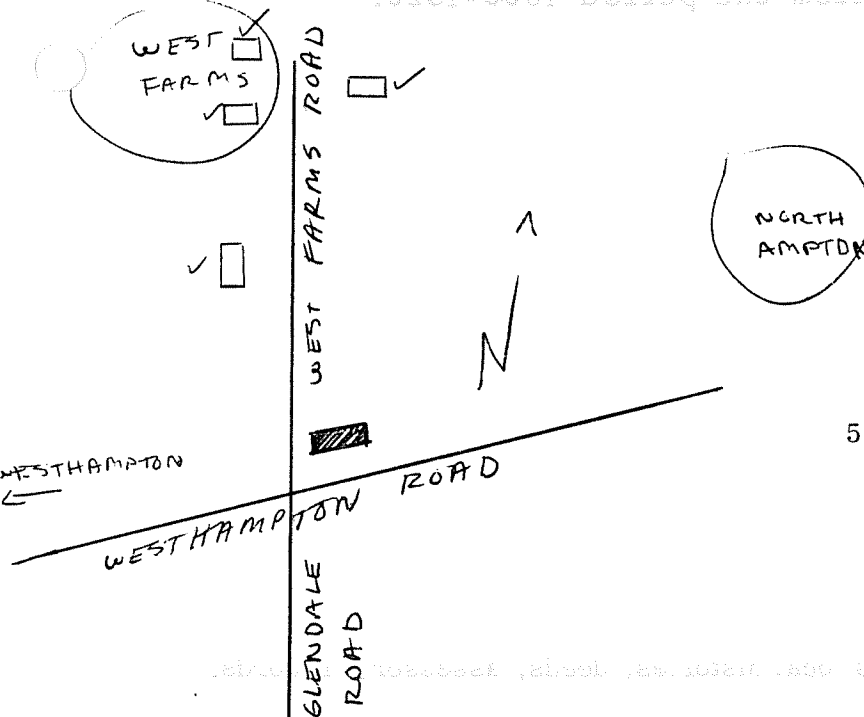

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This early residence is located on Westhampton Road, an early route joining Northampton and the village of Westhampton. The structure is five bays wide and one room deep. The ridge roof has moderate slope and a central chimney. A porch supported by Doric columns surrounds the lower story and shelters a simple entranceway. The structure probably dates from the period 1800-1820.
