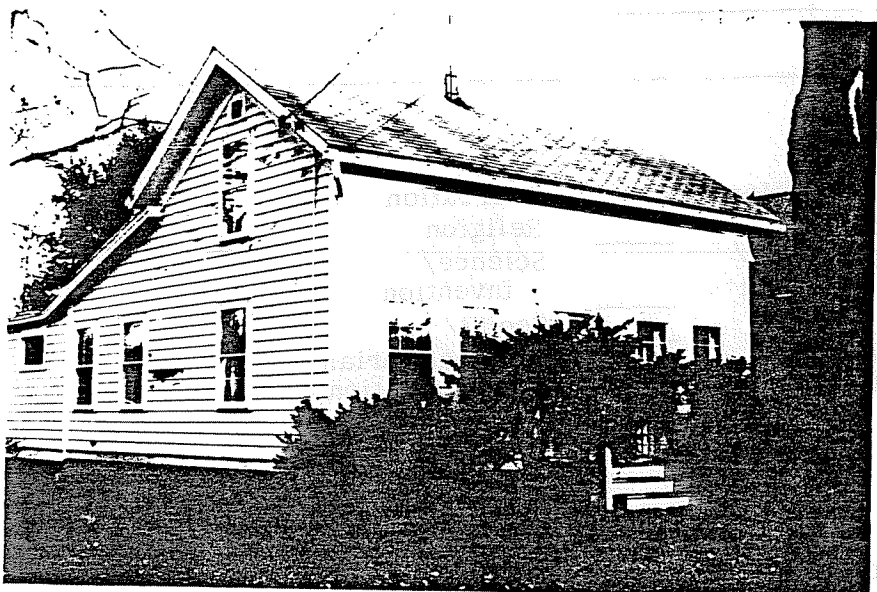

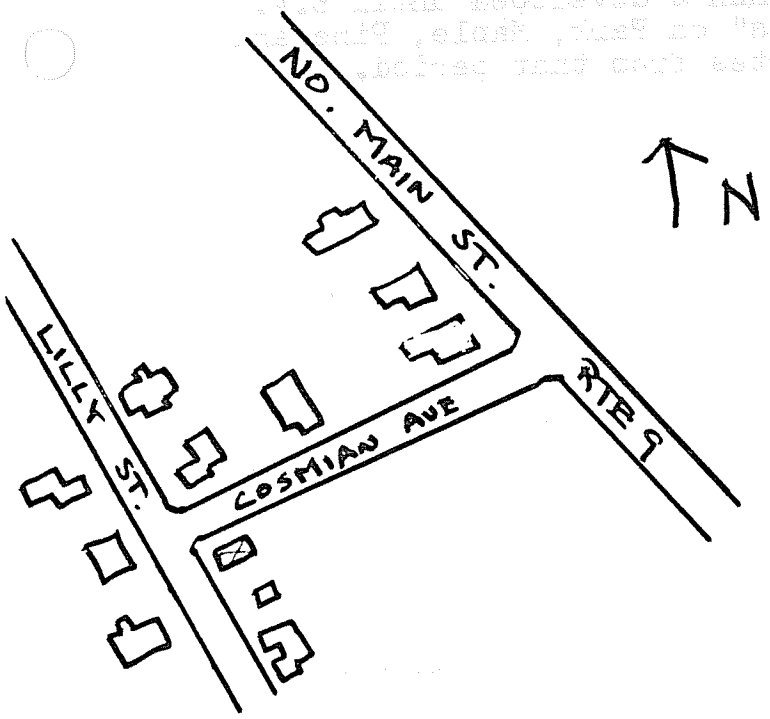

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This small cottage first appears on this site on the 1895 atlas. It was owned and occupied by Frederick Stockwell II, an employee of the Florence Machine Co. However, it is reported that the house was moved from Park St., when a new house was constructed for Albert Shumway (no. 63) about 1890. Park St. is shown as a connecting route on the 1831 map, but wasn't developed until E.W. Eaton's plan of 1846-47 for "Village Lots" on Park, Maple, Pine and ~~W~~ Center Sts. This house probably dates from that period.
