

This cottage was built on lot no. 12 of Alfred Lilly's subdivision plan for the land north and west of the Free Congregational Society's lat the corner of North Main and Meadow Sts. Mr. Lilly was a charter member of Society and prominent in their affairs. In 1887 he paid \$3000 for the tract of which eventually became Lilly St. and its residential lots. The cottage first appears on the 1884 atlas ans is owned by any H. Emerson, a joiner, who perhaps built the house himself. In 1838 the prowas purchased by William and Marinda Smith. Mr. Smith was a jeweler on Main St.	and the land y perty
Florence, and served as the postmaster for Florence during the 1890's	
The house is one story tall with an almost-vertical Mansar capping the block. Tall dormers project from the Mansard. All windows have two sashes and heavy molded cornices, and there is a one-story, three-sided bay on the western side of the house. A small portico with flat roof and chamfered covers the front entrance.	over window
