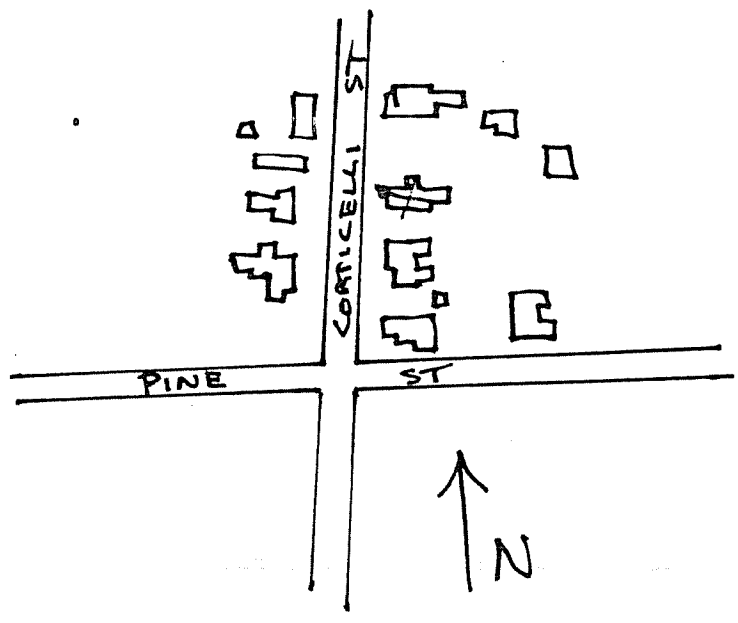

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

*In 1859 Isaac Parsons et al. filed a subdivision plan for part of Park St., and Meadow and Prospect Streets. Prospect St was located atop the eastern terrace of the Mill River and had a fine view westward across the Florence Meadows. By 1873 the street had been mostly built up with cottages for the workers of the Florence Mfg. Co. or the Nonotuck Silk Mills, both nearby on the Mill River.*

*This house is one-and-a-half stories tall with gable end to the street and a one-and-a-half story gabled projection on the northern side. A prominent feature of the house is the one-story front porch. This has turned posts, ornate brackets a simple balustrade.*
