This small, 12 story cottage is located on the hill overlooking the small manufacturing village of Leeds. It is part of the modest subdivision begun by the Nonotuck Silk Co. in the 1870's. The proprietors of the Company owned the land and water privileges in the valley as well as most of the land atop the hill to the northeast. During the 1870's the Company opened up four streets north of Front St., and sold residential lots or had houses built for lease. This property was probably leased as it is isted as being owned by the Nonotuck Silk Co. throughout the 19th Century.

One-and-a-half stories in height with gable end to the street, the house has a one-story porch with posts, brackets and balustrade extending across the facade.
