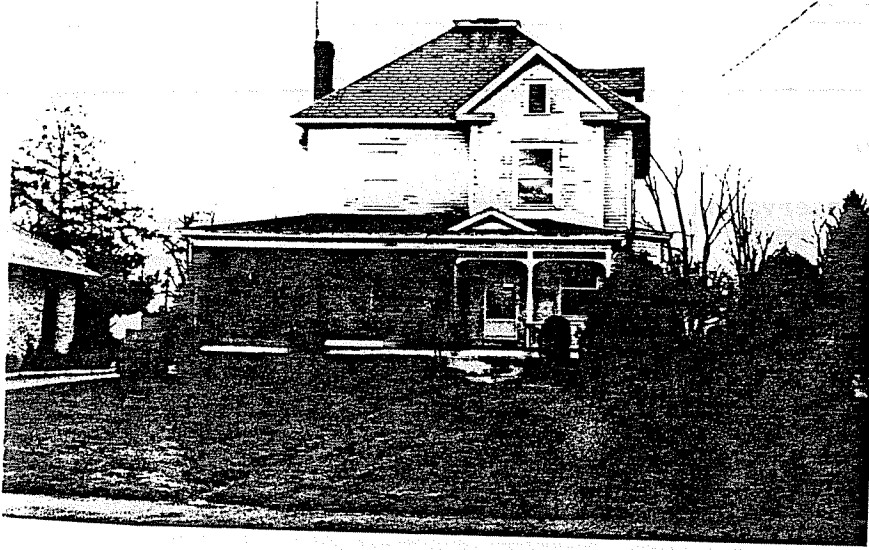

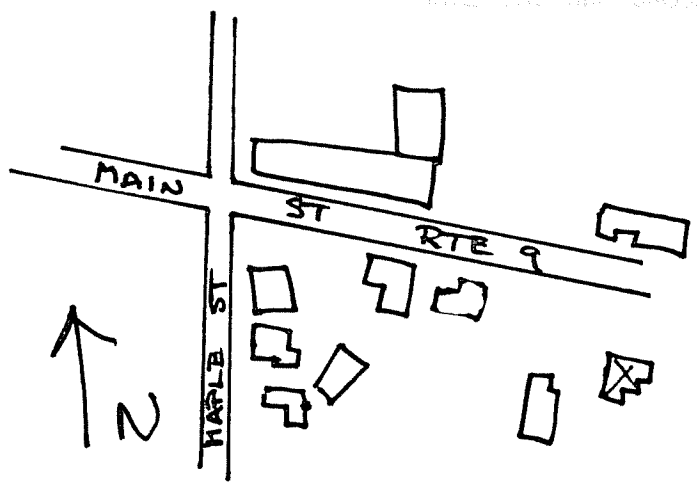

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This large house was constructed around the turn of the century on Main St. in Florence. The first known owner was Roscoe Noble, a real estate and insurance agent.

The house features a slate, high hip roof and a decorative front porch. The porch extends across the facade and halfway along the eastern side, and is composed of hipped roof, turned posts with carved brackets, a spindle frieze and spindle balustrade. A small gable appears above the entrance.
