	This decorative, late 19th century house occ upies a prominent position at the corner of Locust St. (Rt. 9) and Trinity Row, and faces on the triangular park which was established in the late 1860's when E.B. Goodwin filed his subdivision plan for an addition to the village of Florence. This addition covered the undeveloped land atop the plateau east of the village and south of Main St. This was one of the later lots to be developed, with the house being built during the early 1890's. The first known owner and caupant was Nicholas Van Slike a mechanic for the Florence Machine Co. The house is two-and-a-half stories in height, L-shaped and is covered with clapboard on the first floor and shingles above. Decorative shingles are used in the gables. The facade has an interesting triple window and a hipped portico with massive brackets.
