The Northampton Emory Wheel Co. was organized in 1867 by some of the leading local industrialists. Called the "Florence Business Group". these men were involved in most of the Mill River businesses from Bay State to Haydenville, with their major focus being the silk mills of Florence. The Company began in Florence with \$10,000 in capital, but this was soon quadrupled in an 1870 reorganization which saw the business moved to Leeds. Here they rented one of the old woolen mills. After the 1874 Mill River flood they built the one-and-a-half story brick building, and near the end of the 19th century the two-story structure along the river was built.

Emory, a compound found only in Massachusetts, is used in polishing and buffing, two activities intimately connected with the cutlery and brassworks industries. By the 1880's the Company had a branch house in Chicago for marketing its goods in the middle west, and shipped also to England, Frnace, Germany and Sweden. The manufactory remained in production until 1913.
