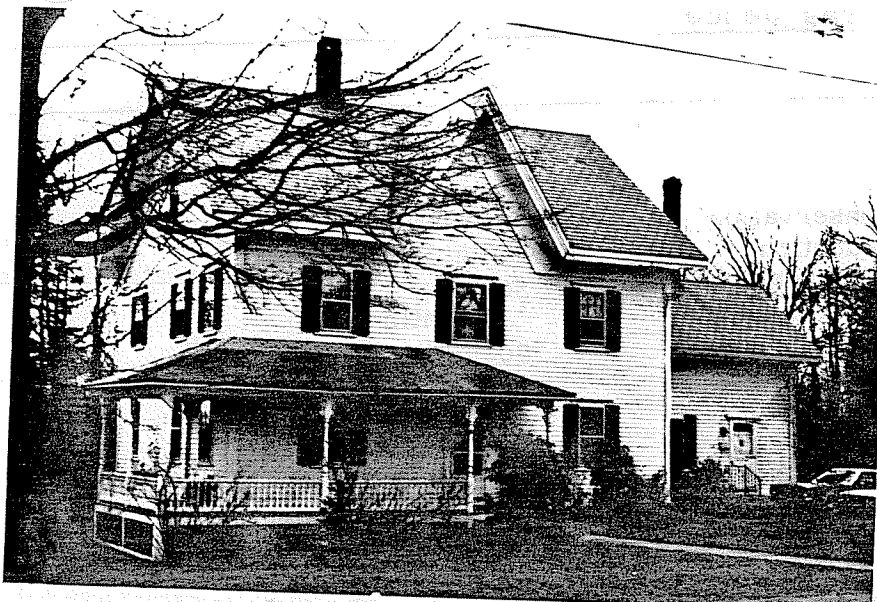

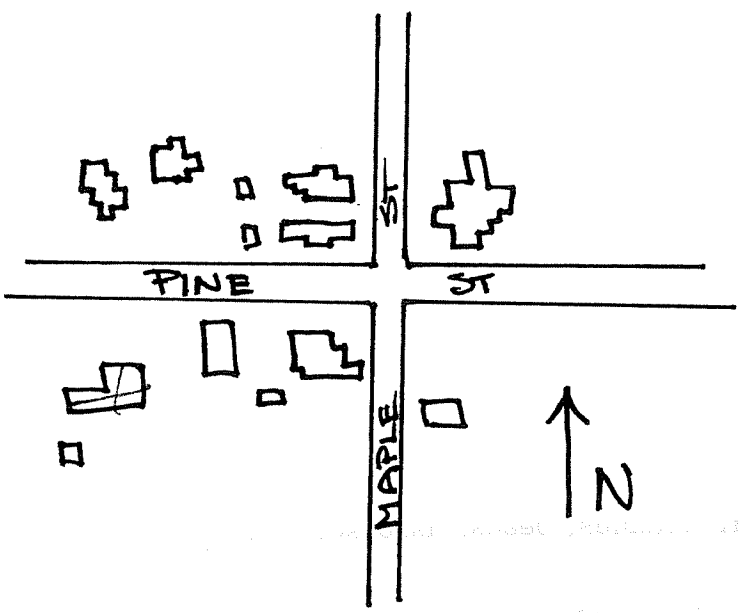

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

This 2½ story house was originally built as a parsonage for the Florence Congregational Church. The land for the church and parsonage was donated by the Greenville Manufacturing Co., a large cotton cloth manufactory in Florence. The church was dedicated in October of 1861 and the parsonage was probably ready soon thereafter.
