Railway Co. and transformed into car barns. The house was transformed into two tenements at about the same time.

Hatfield St. first appears on the 1831 town map and leads, as its name suggests to Hatfield. Locust St. was part of the main stage route westerly from Northampton, thus making this a major junction.

The house is 2% stories in height with gable end to the street and a 2½ story gabled projection on the northern side. The front gable has a rectangular window with six over six sashes, while the other windows in the house have two over two sashes. A one-story porch extends across the facade and partially along both sides of the house. This is composed of hipped roof, turned posts and balustrade. On the southern side of the house are two two-story bay windows.
