John Eyre, a mechanic with the Northampton Cutlery Co., bought an acre of land at the corner of Hinckley and Warner Sts. for \$400.in 1864. His house was built shortly thereafter on Hinckley St. Between 1873 and 1884, a second house was built on the lot, fronting on Warner Street. Mr. Eyre sold this house to his son Henry in 1887 for \$950. Henry Eyre was employed by the Clement Cutlery Co.

The house is one and a half stories in height, L-shaped, with a half-porch on the eastern end on the facade. The porch has simple square posts.
