In 1865 John Cahill bought 1 and 1/3 acres of land fronting on the "highwayfrom Florence to Northampton" (Nonotuck St.) from Samuel L. Hinckley for \$198. The land rose steeply to the southwest up the slopes of Baker's Hill. Shortly thereafter, this small cottage was built. It was set back about 250 feet from Nonotuck St., and 100 feet from Hinckley St. It faced Hinckley and was sited about 30 feet higher than the street,

The house is one and a half stories high, with gable end to Hinckley St., and a one story porch that extends across the three bay facade. The porch has square posts with carved brackets. Both of the first floor facade windows are full length.
