In 1888 Oren Smith bought the rear part of the Wood homestead on Elm St. This homestead was bounded westerly by Massasoit St., which had been opened in 1869, and northerly by Arlington St. By 1895 six houses had been built on Smith's lot, all two stories in height and L-shaped. Variety is provaded through different projections and trim detailing. Smith kept title to this house and lot until 1897 when he sold the property toLouis Campbell, the postmaster, who made his residence here.

The house features a three-story tower with pyramidal slate roof and finial in the crook of the L. Fish-scale shingles are used in the front gable and on the third sotry of the tower.
