Crescent St. was laid out in 1886 midway along the slopes of Round Hill. It quickly became one of the most fashionable streets to build upon in Northampton. This house was built shortly before the turn of the century, probably for John Ruddy, a local policemam at a cost of \$2000

The house is  $2\frac{1}{2}$  stories in height with gable end to the street and a cross gable on the southern side. Fish-scale shingles are used to decorate the front gable, which also contains a projecting double gable. A full-length front porch extends across the facade and is composed of turned posts, a patterned balustrade and curved brackets. On the second floor is a slightly smaller porch with turned posts.
