

	a s 1 f s	Spring St (originally called Hawley Lane) was laid out in the irst third of the 19th century as the upper connector between King St. and Prospect St. In 1852 and 1854 Joseph Haskins, a Prospect St. resident, old land to Varnum Tanner for a combined total of \$383. In October of 854 Mr. Tanner sold this land to Hatfil Washburn, Jr. of Williamsburg or \$1350. The deed mentions the grantor's "new Cottage house thereon tanding". This would seem to be the same house as the present one.  The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with steeply-pitche
