Lemuel and Augusta Field purchased a lot from the Nonotuck Silk Co. This was lot 5 on the company's subdivision plan for the area north of Front St. on the hill overlooking Leeds village. L.B. Field was employed by the Nonotuck Silk Co., listed as a foreman in the 1885-86

Directory and as superintendent of the Wood Department in the 1895-96

Directory.

Originally, the house commanded a fine prospect to the south and east. hut tall firs and spruces have almost totally enclosed the house. tory tower with Mansard roof and round-headed dormers occupies the crook of this 2½ story, L-shaped house. Other details include bay windows and a front porch with turned posts.
