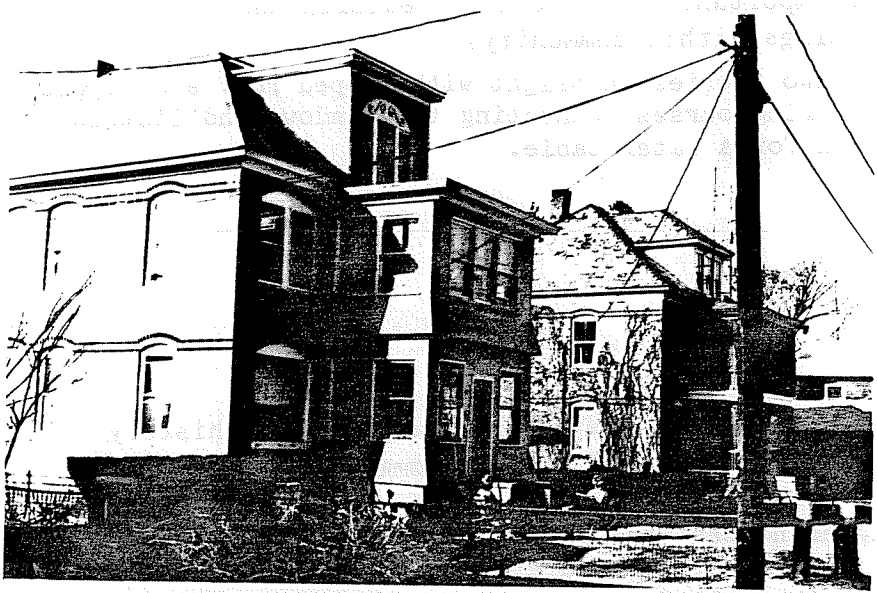

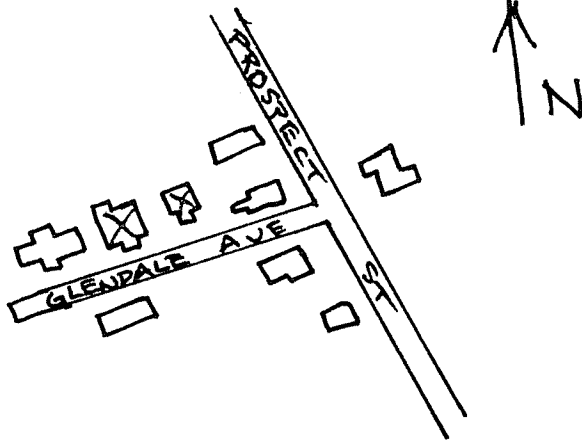

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

Each house is two stories in height with hipped roof and hipped dormer. Black brick is used for stringcourses connecting the windows and lintels on the first and second floors, and for a water table.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

These two duplex houses were built around the turn-of-the-century on a short street north of Round Hill. Daniel Lynch, a mason and builder who lived on Crescent St. just up the hill from here is the probable builder. His own residence is of brick with similar detailing. There's also a four tenement, brick block on this street that Mr. Lynch probably constructed.
