

Orchard St. was laid out about the turn-of-the-century along the eastern boundary of the Bridge St. cemetery. Most of the street was developed with two-family houses, some of which were divided vertically (usually referred to as double houses), and some horizontally (usually referred to as two-family houses). This house is an example of the latter method, and is interesting for the quality of its detailing. This includes leaded-glass transoms on the central windows of the facades two-story bay, fluted posts on the front porches and turned columns and carved brackets (the side porches.
