	This house was built at the southeast corner of Norwood Ave. and Watner St. between 1884 and 1895. The first known owner was Willis Blakesley, an employee of the Northampton Cutlery Co., who was first listed here in 1892.				
	The house is one and a half stories in height, with gable end to the street and a cross gable on the southern side. The gable are clad with fish-scale shingles and a one-story porch with hipped roof, square posts and simple balustrade extends across the facade and wraps around the southern side to the cross gable.
