This house was built around the turn of the century on Maple St. (now Liberty St.). Originally, this lot was part of the Main St. (now Riverside Drive) fronting lot, which was owned by Luke White in 1895. As development in Bay State proceeded however, a number (the deep Main St. lots were subdivided to produce residential lots of the side streets.

The house is two and a half stories high, gable end to the street, with a cross gable on the southern side. A one-story porch with hipped roof, turned posts, fancy brackets and balustrade extends across the facade, while a similar but smaller porch is recessed under the side cross gable.
