

entral are.	The residence is a compact Colonial Revival style dwelling which closely follows the design of brick dwellings of the later 18th century. End chimmneys rise from the ridge roof and balance a symmetrical facade five bays wide. In the ground floor the window openings are set off by keystones marking the pediments; a semi-circular portico supported by columns shields a sidelit entrance. To the rear a two story el with Palladian windows and a bank of windows departs from the colonial form reproduced
