In 1888 Oren Smith bought the rear part of the Wood homestead on Elm St. This homestead was bounded westerly by Massasoit St., which had been opened in 1869, and northerly by Arlington St. By 1895 six houses had been built, all two stories in height and L-shaped. Variety is provided through different projections and trim detailing. In 1891 Mr. Smith sold this house and lot to Catherine Brown.

This house features saw-tooth boarding in the gables, a patterned string course between the clapboarded first soory and shingled second story, a bay window with front pediment and bracketed cornice on the facade and a wrap-around porch with spindle frieze, turned posts with small decorative brackets, and a turned balustrade.
