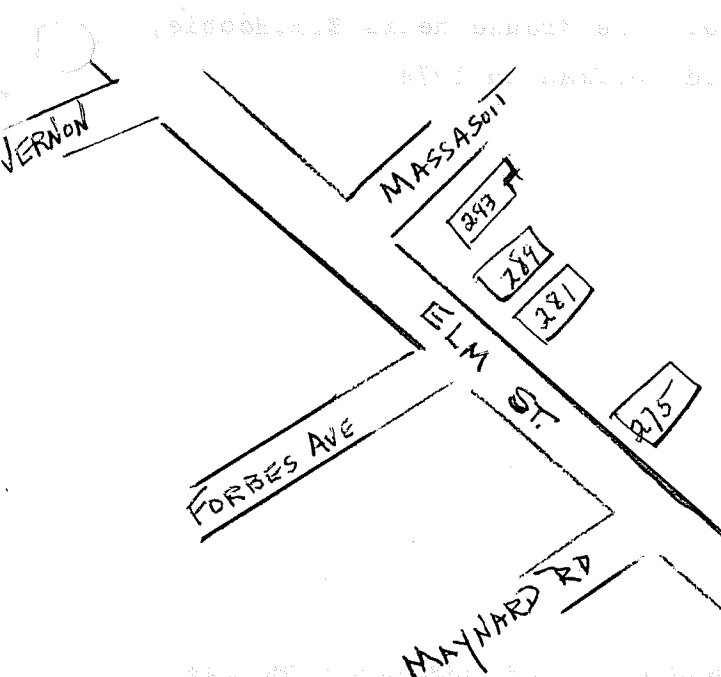

9. Historical Significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Heirs of Andrew Wood who lived at 289 Elm Street sold land at the corner of Massasoil Street first to Oren B. Smith, Smith sold to Lewis J. Dudley on June 3, 1891. Dudley, prominent in Northampton, built the house soon after that date; it appears on the Map of Northampton 1895. In 1918 the property was sold by the Trustees of Lewis Dudley to Frances T. Krause. The Krause heirs E.H. Hobbie, Francis A Reynolds, sold to Dr. David Koffman in 1974
