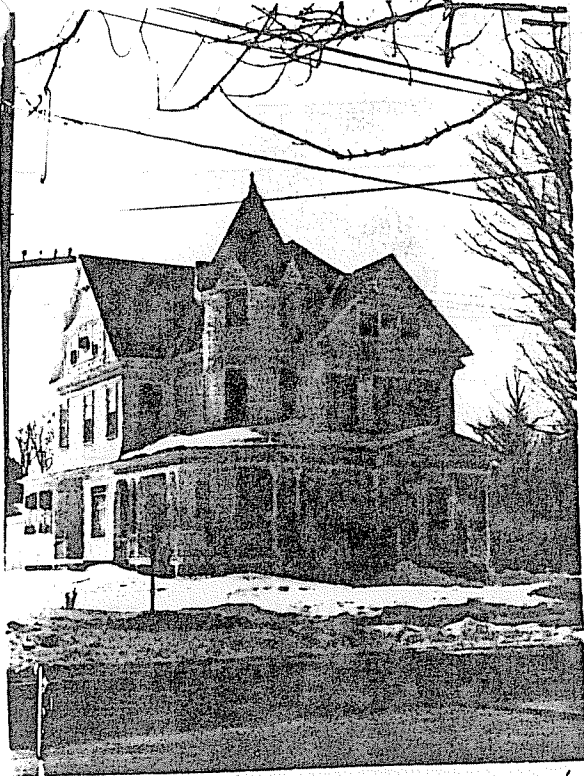


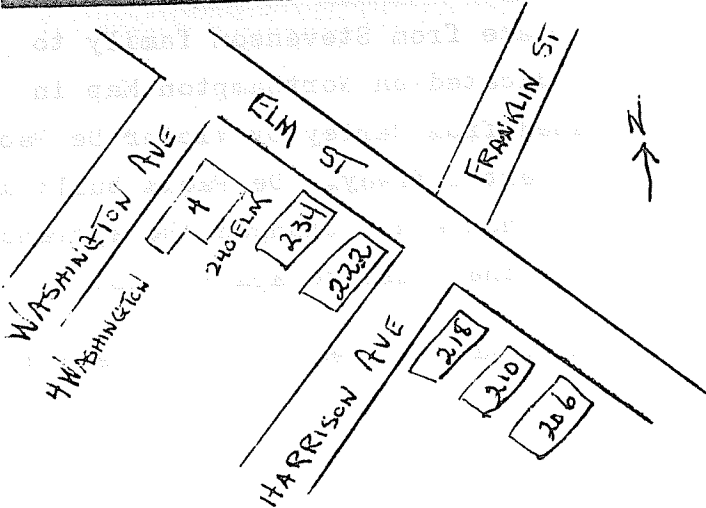

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Land in this area the property of Asa Wright was plotted in 1870 when Washington Avenue was opened from Elm Street. Wright sold a lot, 150 ft on Elm x 200 ft on Washington to Benjamin Stevenson. Map of Northampton 1884 indicates C. A. Stevenson resident in this house. Ownership and life use alternate from Stevenson family to Carleys. A. G. Carley is resident indicated on Northampton Map in 1895. In 1940 the house was purchased from Carley by Victor De Paola, father of the present owner, Mrs. Robert Jeffway. De Paola built an addition on the Washington end of the house and changed the entrance to 4 Washington Avenue. He converted the house to apartments.

The original lot, 150 ft on Elm Street was divided probably before the house was built.
