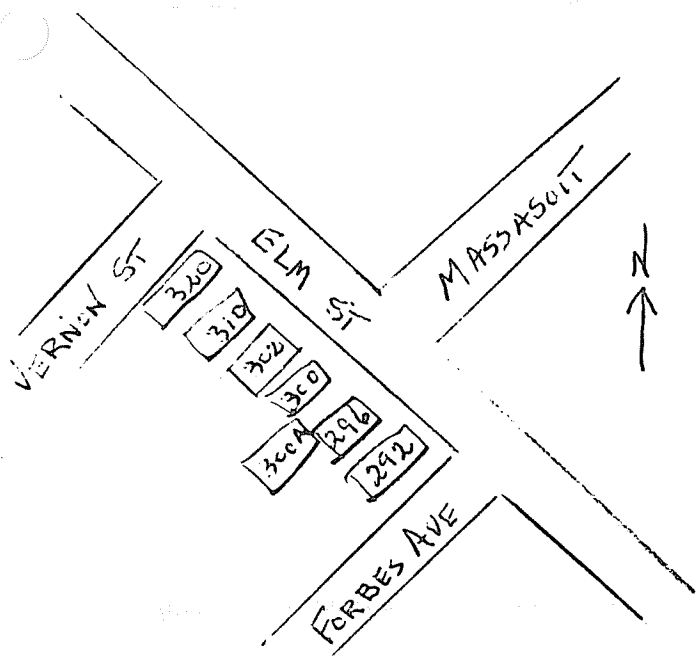

Land part of Jewett property, platted in 1887. Lot, purchased among others by F. A. Macomber in 1890, sold to W.K. Stabb in 1901. House built in 1901, occupied by Staabs until 1911. Occupied by Kirkpatrick and later by George Spear. Purchased by Raymond in 1936.

Alice Kirkpatrick who lived in the house from 1912 - 14 was a Professor at Smith College.
