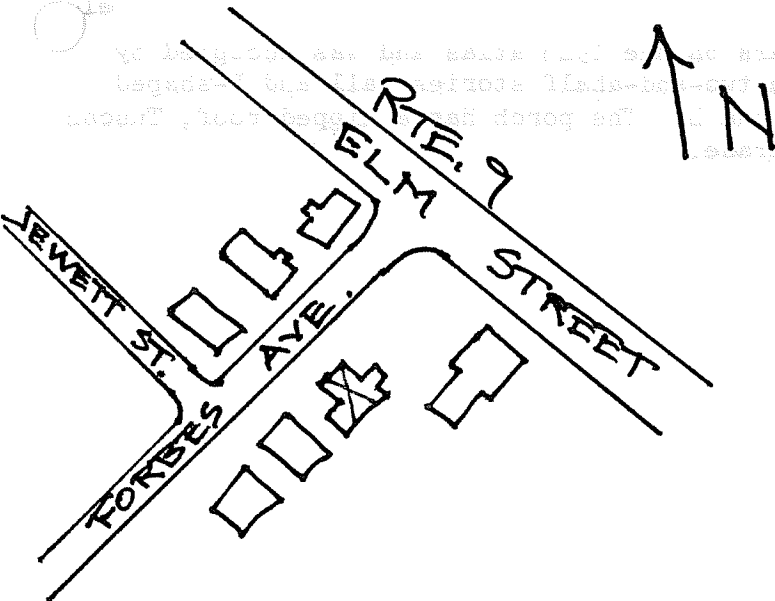

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

Forbes Ave. was opened off of Elm St. in 1887 by J.C. Hammond and J.A. Sullivan, two developers who played a prominent role in opening up a number of residential tracts in Northampton around the turn-of-the-century. The western end of the street, from the rear of Vernon Street School to Washington Place, was opened during the mid 1920's.

This house first appears on the 1915 atlas and was occupied by George Payne, a gardener. The house is two-and-a-half stories tall and L-shaped with a one-story porch in the crook of the L. The porch has a hipped roof, Tuscan columns on brick pedestals and a balustrade.
