In 1870 John Minor and James Searle filed a subdivision plan for Washington Ave. During the same year they sold lot no. 6 to Reuben Garfield for \$600. Mr. Garfield was a carpenter and probably built this house himself. The house first appears on the 1873 atlas and is listed as the residence of R.J. Garfield.

The house is 2 and 1/2 stories in height with gable end to the street and a 2 and 1/2 story gaboed projection on the western side. The front gable has a round-headed louvered form, while the side gable has a louvered oculus. A onestory porch extends across the three-bay facade and along the western side to the projection. It's composed of flat roof with projecting cornice, chamfered posts with ornate brackets and a turned balustrade. In the rear of the property is a carriage house with slate roof and cupola.
