This house was built for Edwin Emerson in 1895 from designs of Putnam and Bayley at a cost of \$4000. Mr. Emerson was co-owner of a Main St. store which carried paints and oils, as well as contracting for painting and paper hanging. Putnam and Bayley were members of an architectural firm that had been established in 1893. Within two years twelve houses had been constructed from their design in Northampton. Mr. Bayley soon left the area, but Roswell Putnem remained and became one of the most prominent local architects of the turn-of-the-century period.

The house is 2 and 1/2 stories in height, and has a projecting, pedimented gable on the facade and eastern side. These are set off from the block of the house by a dentil frieze. The facade has a pedimented portico with ornate, low-relief sculpture in the tympanum, Ionic columns and balustrade. The entrance has sidelights and is flanked by fluted pilasters and capped by an entablature. On the eastern side is a large stained glass window.
