

in Florence for \$300. Frederick was one of the three Campbell brothers from Plainfield, Mass. to buy adjacent lots on North Mian Stl during the early 1870's. His house doesn't appear on the 1873 atlas, but he is listed here in the 1875 directory, and is described as a painter.

The house is two-and-abhalf stories tall with gable end to the street and an ell on the southern side. The windows are rectangular with two over two sashes and have raking hood supported by modillions. A continuous, one-story porch extends across the facade, along the southern side to the ell, and then along the front of the ell. The porch has a hipped roof with projecting cornice and thin, square posts with decorative brackets.
