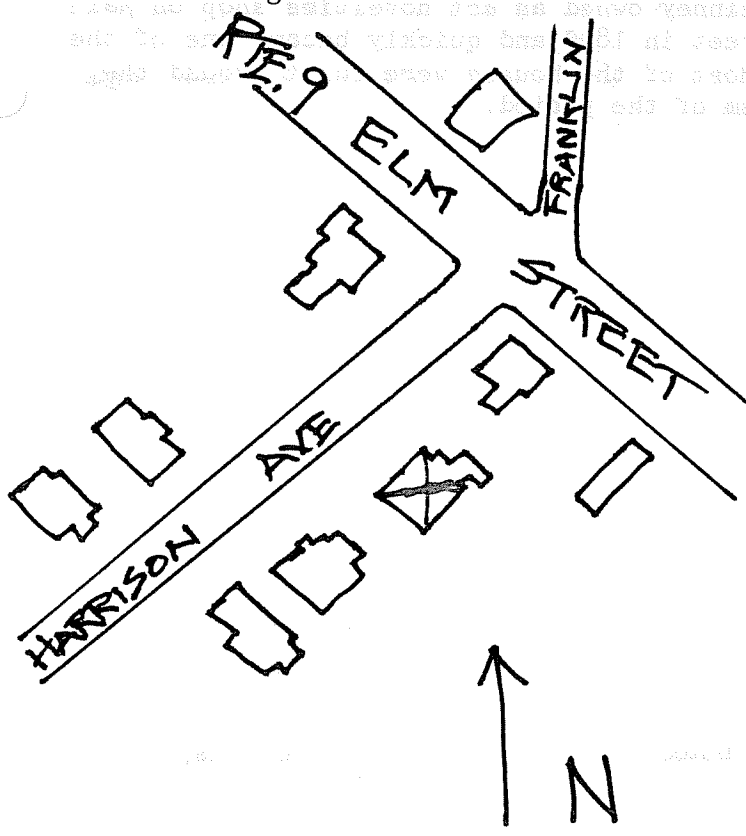

This house was built for Miss Georgia Phinney and her widowed mother in 1916 at a cost of \$6000. Miss Phinney owned an art novelties shop on Main St. Harrison Ave. had been opened as a street in 1890 and quickly became one of the most fashionable streets in Northampton. Most of the houses were built around the turn of the century and show the eclecticism of the period.
