Mensington ave. was obened in 1390 by Charles Grouch, one of Morthampton's most prolific developers, and described in his objituary as "one of the most enterprising citizens the town ever had... his most was progress." He built about 150 houses in a rthampton, either as tenement houses or on contract for others. By 1995 there were 15 houses built on the street and by 1915 all of the lots but two were filled with houses.

This house appears on the 1095 at less as property of Micheal Keating, a mason who who is also first listed here in the 1395 directory. The house is 2% stories tall with gable end to the street. The front gable is cover with wood shingles laid in a decorative pattern and a 1 story porch covers the facade. The porch has a shed roof, turned posts with fun brackets and a patterned balustrade.
