Mr. Warner's house is by far the most pretentious and well- sited of all the houses along North Main St. in Florence. The house is situated far back from the road, at the edge of the terrace over- looking the Florence meadows and the Mill River. A long circular driv leads to and from the house. The house is two-and-a-half stories in height with gambrel roof and an ell, also gambrel roofed, on the north side. A stuccoed cross gambrel projects from the facade and has a two-story stuccoed bay with a polygonal roof and exposed rafters on its northern end. A large sunporch occupies the souther side of the house.
